How to Write a Comic Strip

Step 1: Choose a tone

The tone is how the comic will make the reader feel. If your tone is funny, then the reader will laugh and feel happy. If the tone is serious, the reader will think about what the comic strip says and reflect on it.

Example tones: Humorous/funny, serious, joyful, mysterious, sad

Step 2: Describe the setting

The setting describes where the comic strip is taking place.

Example settings: kitchen, table in the ice cream shop, outside the ice cream shop.

Step 3: Describe the plot

The plot is the main events of the comic. It is what happens during the comic.

Example plots: Someone stole all the ice cream, a bug was in someone's ice cream, a weird ice cream flavor was released that no one likes

Step 4: Choose characters

Characters are the people involved in the comic strip.

Example characters: Two friends, a dog, a family, employee at the ice cream shop

Step 5: Start writing!

You will write your story in 8 panels. Each panel should have at least one character and involve the plot.

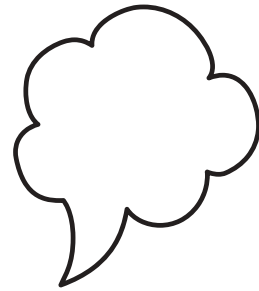
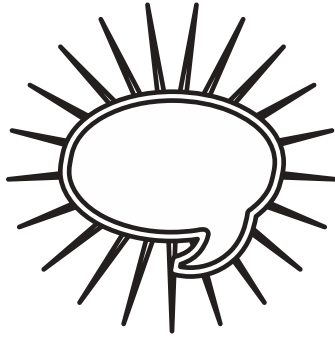




Tips to Make an Awesome Comic Strip
