1. Why did people feel differently about the building of the Transcontinental Railroad?

Wealthy businessmen were happy because they would make a lot of money off the railroad once it was built. On the other hand, people of the Meskwaki Nation felt differently about the railroad being built. They were not happy. The railroad was going to be built through their land and destroy it. Because the railroad was built on their land, they were forced to move so that the railroad could be completed. Immigrants and African Americans who built the railroad were exhausted and angry. It was extremely difficult to build the railroad and they had to work very long hours.

2. Why is it important for historians to talk about how people had different perspectives on the Transcontinental Railroad?

Historians should make sure to include all points of view. That way, people will understand different groups' feelings and attitudes about historical events.
