Step 4: Design Placemat


Ask your teacher for a placemat border. Draw your placemat in the border. Be sure to use lots of color!





Thanksgiving Story

The Pilgrims met an Indian named Tisquantum, a member of the Pawtuxet Indian tribe. This group belonged to a much larger group called the Wampanoag Indians. The Wampanoag Indians had lived in the area for over 10,000 years. Tisquantum offered to help the Pilgrims. With his help, the Pilgrims learned how to fish and plant crops, like corn.












Building A Mayflower


Step 1: Choose a boat material.

Look at the materials your teacher has laid out. Find something that will be the base of your boat. You might use a box or something else that is similar.



Step 2: Build a Mast

The mast of the ship is the piece that holds up the sail. Use popsicle sticks, straws, or something else to create a mast.



Step 3: Build the Sail

The sail is the part of the ship that catches the wind to help the ship move. Use tissue paper, construction paper, or something else to make the sail.
