

Examples of Why Countries Trade

Buying and Selling Bananas

Ecuador is a country that sells bananas to other countries around the world. One country might buy bananas from Ecuador if it doesn't grow bananas itself. For example, Italy does not grow bananas so it buys bananas from Ecuador.

Another country might buy bananas from Ecuador even though that country grows bananas too. This is because there are many types of bananas that can be grown. For example, Africa grows bananas that are good for cooking but not good to eat just by themselves.



Buying and Selling Cars

Germany is a country that sells cars to other countries around the world. One country might buy cars from Germany because it doesn't make cars itself. For example, Israel buys cars from Germany.

Another country might buy certain parts of a car because its factories do not make all the parts that are needed to make the cars. For example, the United States makes cars. But, they buy some parts for those cars from other countries such as Mexico. This is because, in Mexico, the parts do not cost as much to make.



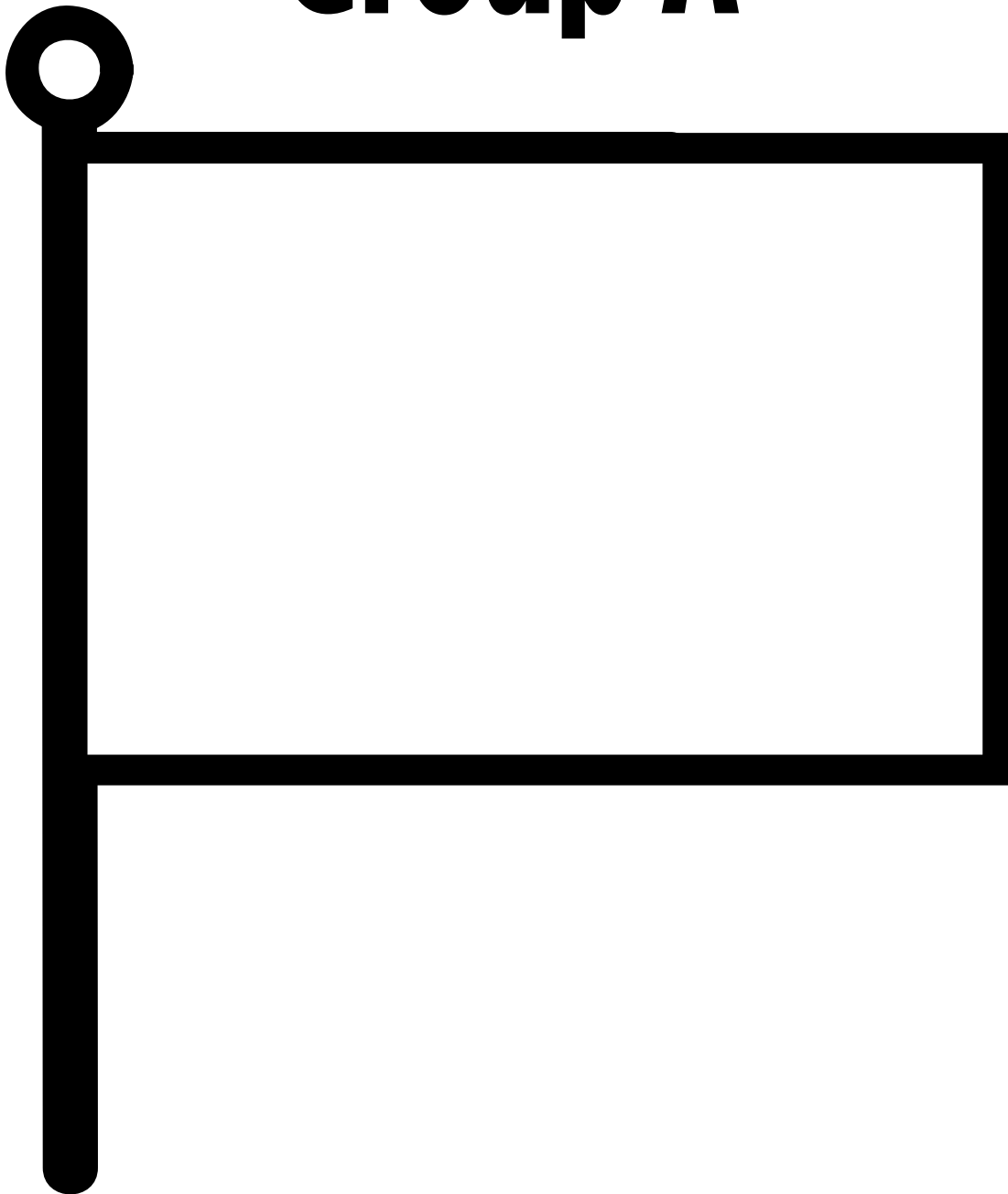
Rules of the Game
