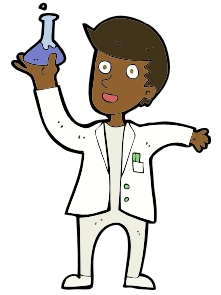

Being Unique

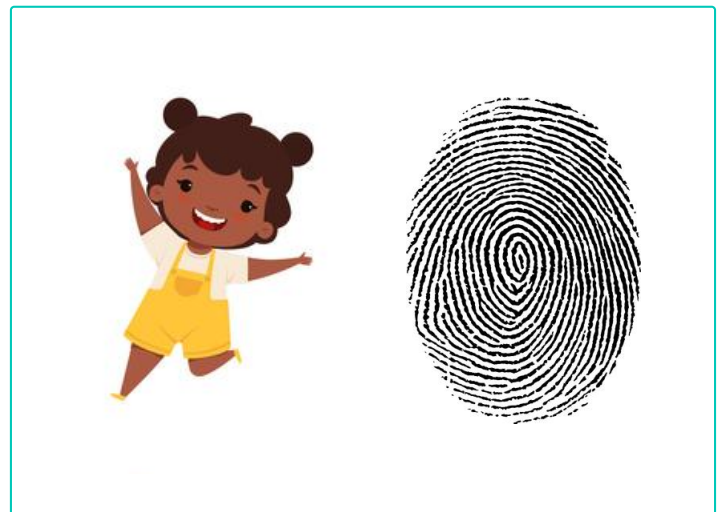
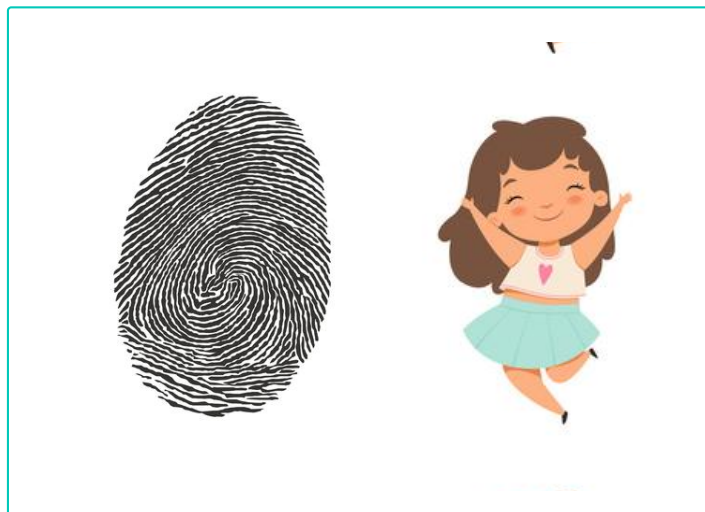
Hi! I am Brendan. I am a scientist. A scientist learns about the world. For example, scientists learn about plants, animals, and humans!
