





Step 1: Make a Timeline

Pilgrims met an Indian named Tisquantum in America.






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Step 2: Write What You Are Thankful For


When I write stories about Thanksgiving, I like to focus on things I am thankful for. In the turkey feathers below, write or draw what you are thankful for.





History of Thanksgiving

In 1620, people took a boat, called the *Mayflower*, from England to America. The people are known as Pilgrims!



When the Pilgrims arrived in America, it was very cold outside. It was November! The Pilgrims had to build homes and find food in the cold weather. They were worried because they didn't know how to find food or build homes in America.





The Pilgrims met an Indian named Tisquantum. Tisquantum was a member of the Pawtuxet Indian tribe. This group belonged to a much larger group called the Wampanoag Indians.

The Wampanoag Indians had lived in the area for over 10,000 years.



History of Thanksgiving

Tisquantum offered to help the Pilgrims.

With his help, the Pilgrims learned how to fish and plant crops, like corn. They also learned how to make houses that could keep them warm in the winter!



In the fall of 1621, the Pilgrims and the Pawtuxet Indians prepared a large feast. The Pawtuxet Indians brought deer. There was also fresh fish to eat and vegetables, such as corn and pumpkin. The Pilgrims were very thankful for the help from the Paxtuxet Indians.



Today, we continue this tradition of giving thanks every year. We celebrate Thanksgiving in the fall to remember this earlier feast. We celebrate with family and friends, just like the Pilgrims and Pawtuxet Indians did a long time ago.
