

Inspiration From Paleolithic Art and Music- Answer Key

1. Hunter-gatherers moved around a lot to find food sources. Portable art was important because they could carry the pieces with them every time they moved. Many pieces of portable art were important to the religion they worshiped.
2. Hunter-gatherers often painted animals and other items from nature. They also used materials from nature to create their art. This suggests that nature was important to their religion, art and music, and way of life.
3. Hunter-gatherers used materials from nature, like animal blood and layers of earth, to create colors used to paint. Hunter-gatherers also sang and clapped in caves so that their music could be heard loudly and clearly.
4. Hunter-gatherer societies had similar ways of creating art no matter where they lived. This suggests they had access to similar resources and had similar ways of living, even though they never crossed paths.
