WHO IS TOMAS?

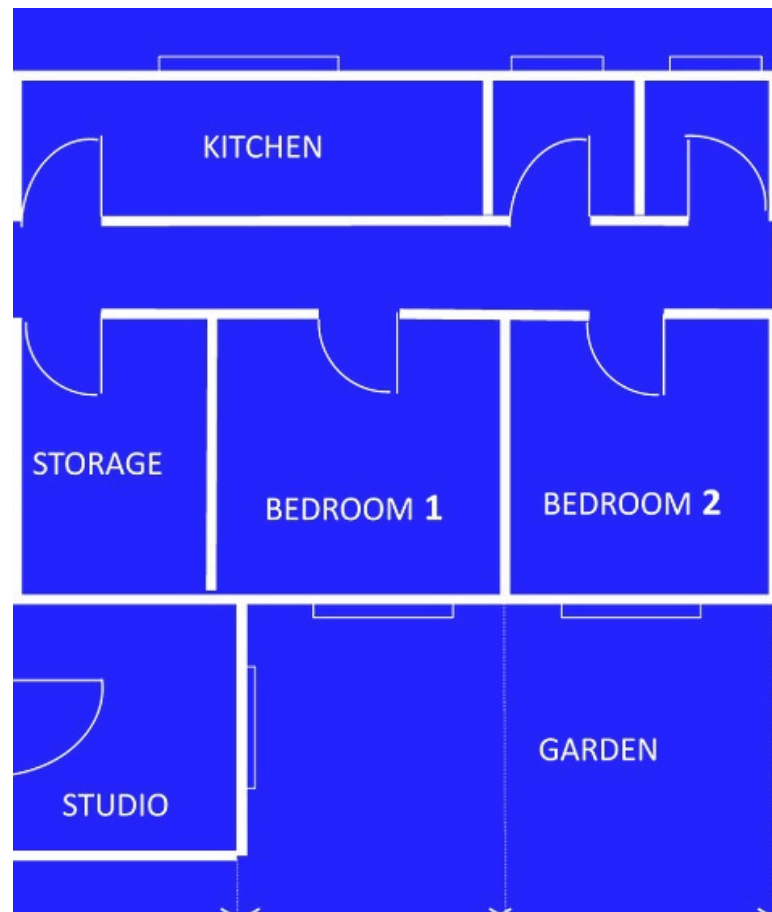


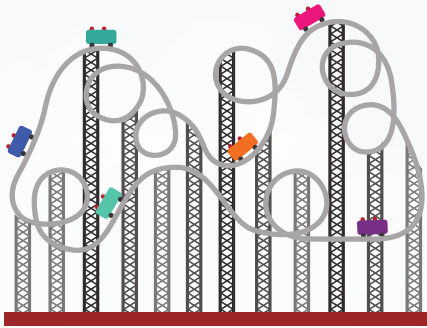
Tomas is a theme park architect. An architect is a person who designs buildings and structures. Architects decide what buildings will look like and what materials to build with. Theme park architects also make sure buildings are safe and won't fall apart. Some architects work at theme parks. Doesn't that sound like fun? Theme park architects are in charge of designing rides, water slides, and other buildings (like bathrooms and restaurants). Theme park architects also have to make sure that rides are safe and fun.



WHAT IS A BLUEPRINT?

After architects come up with an idea, they sketch them out on a **blueprint** before they start building. A blueprint is a drawing of what a building will look like. The blueprint to the right shows the inside of a house. Why do you think architects draw blueprints first? Architects draw blueprints first so they can get feedback from other architects. Can you imagine if you built a giant roller coaster and then realized you needed to change something?





Fun Facts about Roller Coasters

In England, there is a roller coaster that has 14 loops! How cool to be the architect that designed this roller coaster!

The fastest roller coaster is located in Abu Dhabi and goes 149 miles per hour! Architects had to figure out what materials can handle this speed! Would you like to be the architect that tests this roller coaster out?

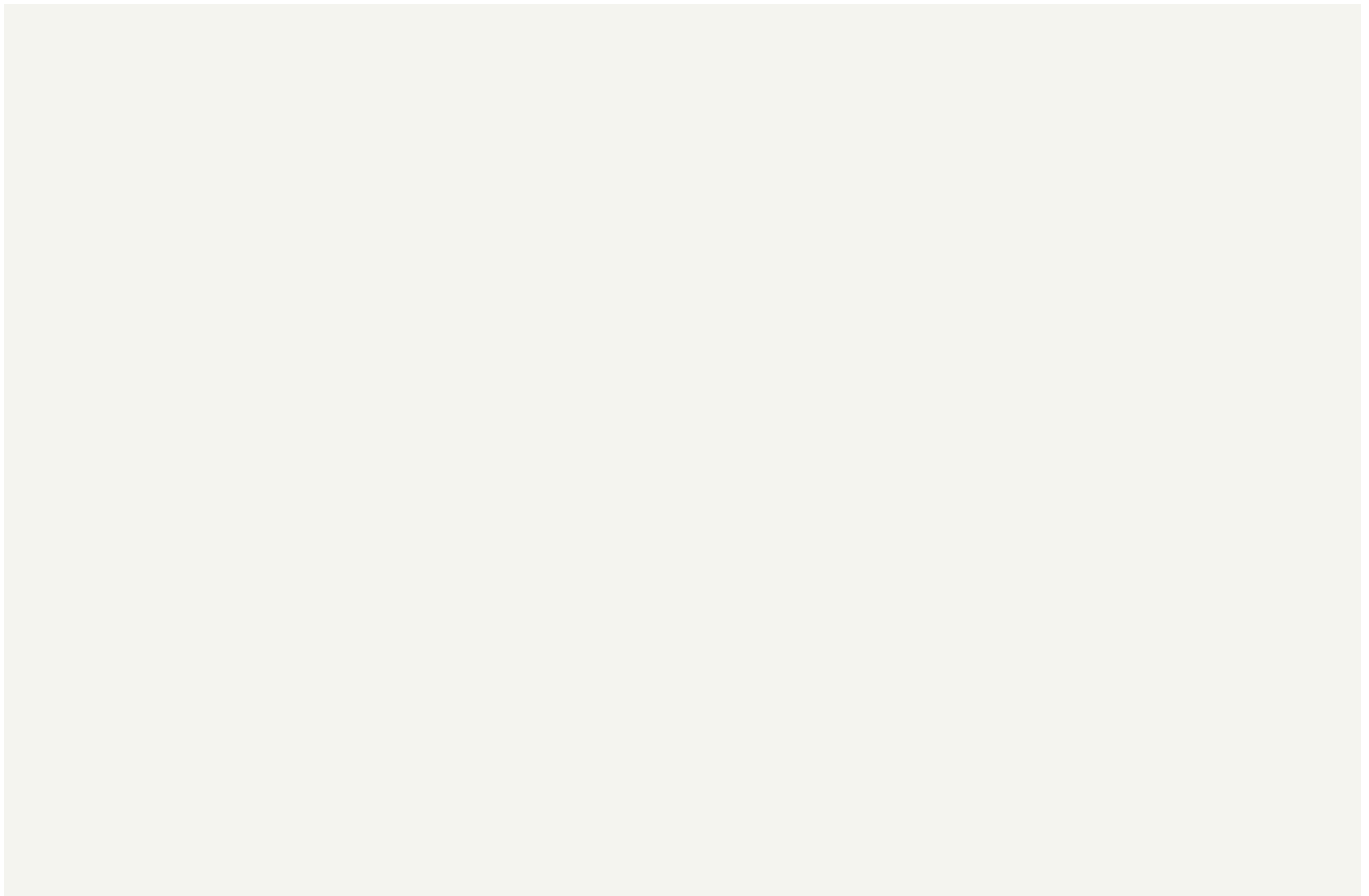
